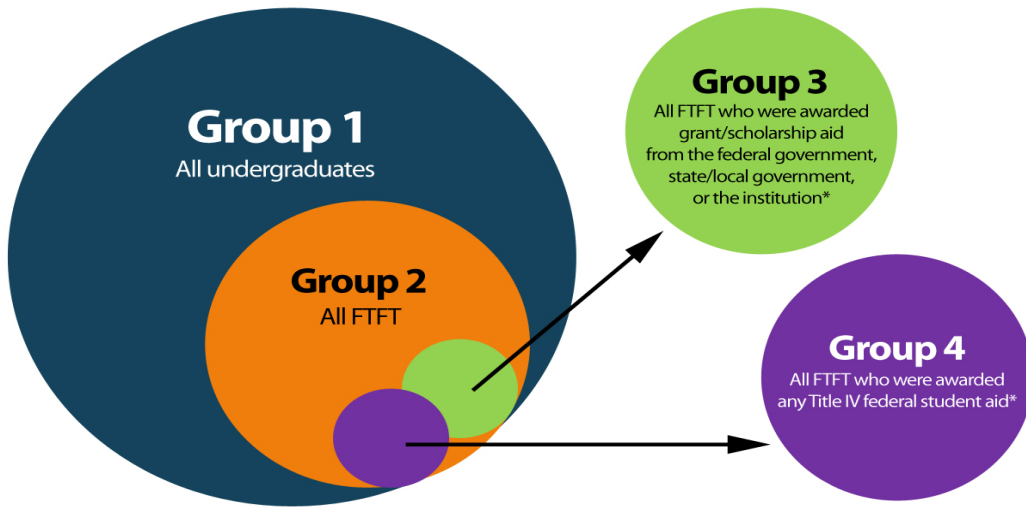

COA Revisions

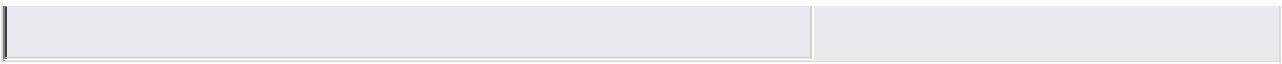
